In accordance with the policy of recognition of local autonomy that has encouraged Nottingham Airport to be renamed Doncaster Robin Hood Airport, Liverpool Airport to be renamed John Lennon International Airport, and Southampton Eastleigh to be renamed R J Mitchell International Airport it is proposed that henceforth the prevailing local dialect shall be recognised for Air Traffic Control purposes. This follows the precedent created at Quebec Airport, Canada several years ago.

In Scotland and Northern Ireland all communications shall be conducted solely in Gaelic, and at Cardiff and Swansea the Welsh language shall be used. Newcastle shall henceforth speak Geordie while John Lennon International shall transmit in Scouse.

Consideration has been given to the appropriate dialect for use at London Airports, but for the time being the use of Cockney Rhyming Slang shall be restricted to London City Airport.

The Department will shortly be publishing a booklet (BLSUP 1) specifying the correct aeronautical terms for ATC purposes within the relevant Control Zone. On route the customary lack of communication shall prevail

Visit to the Battle of Britain Operations Room at RAF Uxbridge Wednesday 6th July 2005

RAF Uxbridge has now confirmed our above visit.

Headquarters No 11 Group 11, Fighter Command was responsible for the air defence of London and the South East of England during the last war and the Operations Room at RAF Uxbridge exists to-day as it did on the 15th September 1940 – the day it was visited by Winston Churchill to witness the conduct of the Battle.

The plotting room with its large map display, and the illuminated tote boards showing the readiness state of fighter squadrons are all still in place. The plotting room is overlooked by three glass fronted control rooms and adjacent are further rooms, which now house an interesting display of wartime memorabilia. Our visit will include a talk in the operations room on the actual Battle of Britain. These visits normally take up to about two hours

The operations room etc is deep underground and is reached by 76 steps and please be advised there is no lift!

As usual the event is by air or road. For those travelling by air please use Denham airfield (EGLD) and then walk over to the Biggles Restaurant which is near by and easy to spot For those coming by car please proceed direct to the Biggles Restaurant where there is a car park Please ensure that we have all met up for lunch by 12-00 noon. A fixed price two-course lunch is being arranged,.

Transport is needed to take members from the restaurant to RAF Uxbridge and for return later. To save the cost of hired transport we look for volunteers from those coming by car to help those coming by air. If you can help please indicate appropriately on the Registration Form.

Denham airfield and restaurant are easily accessed from the M25/M40 direction. Going eastward from the M25 leave the M40 at the first junction bearing left shortly coming to traffic lights where turn right onto A412. Go through the next set of traffic light then take the next left into Tilehouse Lane. Denham is about one mile up this road. For Denham to RAF Uxbridge back track to M40, cross onto A4020 and stay on this road through centre, there are signs here for RAF Uxbridge which will be spotted on the left side of the road. Go in at main gate and report at the Guard Room.

RAF Uxbridge make no charge for admission depending on donations for maintenance etc so a suitable donation from IFFR is incorporated in the quoted overall cost price for this trip. Should there be any unforeseen extras, payment will be collected on the day. Due to space limitation at both the museum and the restaurant total numbers for the trip will have to be <u>limited to a maximum of 30</u>.
